RE: NPDES Permit No. AL0078875

After a recent public hearing at Brooks High School on the proposed waste water treatment plant near Mill and Blue Water Creeks in Lauderdale County, I have concerns over the hydrographic study paid for by residents and conducted by Thomas Aley, an Alabama licensed geologist.

A report from the study noted 13 conclusions against engineering on the proposed site. Some of those conclusions include several claims of false data on submitted soil types characteristic of bedrock, omission of existence of on-site residential sewer systems, failure to discuss or evaluate 3 other alternative solutions and the fact that 90% of the total sewage would be from the Killen city limits which would be economically non-viable and unsolved concerns over ground water contamination from Mill Creek.

I remain reserved over the issuance of a permit for the proposed location and the lack of a State regulatory commission overseeing such issues in our rural areas.

Your careful consideration of these concerns is very much appreciated.
